

## General

As a visitor to our website, you are in safe hands. Below is our data policy, which covers the information we collect to ensure the user experience on our site. Furthermore, we describe why you can navigate our site with peace of mind without worrying about us abusing your digital footprints on the site.

## Cookies

We use cookies on our home page, which is data stored on your device (computer, mobile, tablet or the like). This data aims to recognize your device and increase usability while remembering settings, targeting ads, and more.

It is possible to delete your cookies and alternatively block them. However, if you delete or block your cookies, the ads you see will not be as relevant to you. In addition, ads will appear to you more often.

## Personal data

When you access our website, your personal data is recorded. Personal data is information that leads back to you. This may be, for example, information about your computer or mobile phone, IP number, geographic location, and your navigation on the page. This information may be used in connection with newsletters, competitions, surveys, etc.

If you consent to and enter your name, email, address, phone number and payment information, this information can also be processed. As a rule, this information will only be current to access when creating a purchase or login.

## Purpose of storing information

This information is intended to identify you as a user so that the ads you may see are of maximum relevance. Furthermore, the information is used to record purchases and payments, as well as ensure that the services you demand are delivered correctly – this can be newsletters, messages, etc.

## Safeguards

Technical and organisational measures have been taken against the deletion, publication, manipulation, deterioration or misuse of any information we may possess in breach of the law.

### **Timeframe for storing information**

The information is stored for the period permitted by law. They will be deleted when it is no longer necessary to store them. The period of storage depends on the information and the reason for storage – therefore it is not possible to clarify the overall length of the period.

### **Disclosure of information to third parties**

The information known is disclosed to a number of third parties. These third parties process information on our behalf and may not use it for their own purposes. As mentioned earlier, personal data such as name, e-mail, address mf. will only be disclosed if consent has been given to this. Our data processors consist exclusively of companies in the EU or in countries that have requirements for adequate protection of your data.

### **Access to information and complaints**

It is always your right to be informed of exactly the rest of the personal data we process about you. In addition, you can opt out of using the information at any time. In addition, you may have your consent revoked for information about you to be processed. If any information that may be processed is incorrect, you have the right to have it deleted or corrected.
